Monti Datta, a political science professor, researches human rights and modern day slavery. His research helped launch the Global Slavery Index, which assesses the prevalence of human trafficking across the world. He is also an expert on U.S. policy towards North Korea and can speak to global governance and anti-Americanism.



Stephen Long

Stephen Long, a political science professor, is an expert on American foreign policy and international relations. His research focuses on the causes of war and rivalries, nuclear proliferation, and alliance politics. He can speak to issues of national security and U.S. relations with Russia, Iran, and North Korea.



Sheila Carapico

Sheila Carapico, a political science professor, is a leading expert on Yemen and serves on the Academic Advisory Board of the Arab Center Washington DC, a research organization dedicated to furthering the political, economic, and social understanding of the Arab world in the United States and to providing insight on U.S. policies and interests in the Middle East. She can speak to U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East.



Martha Merritt

Martha Merritt is the dean of international education and a political scientist. Her research interests include Russian foreign policy, comparative politics, comparative theories of democracy, political accountability and peace studies.



Yucel Yanikdag

Yucel Yanikdag is an associate professor of history, an Istanbul native, and the author of *Healing the Nation: Prisoners of War, Medicine and Nationalism in Turkey, 1914-1939*. He can speak about modern Turkey and nationalism in the Middle East.
